Good afternoon to all families,

You will find below important information for the coming weeks. Please take the time to read each section carefully. If you have any questions, we remain available to assist you. The document is two pages long, and all the information provided is important. Thank you for taking the time to read it in full. As a reminder, the last day of regular classes is on Tuesday June 9th, 2026. All students are expected to be present at school for their regular classes next week.

Reminder for Final Exams or French Exam Exemption: The final blocked exam schedule starts on Wednesday June 10th, 2026. As a reminder, you can find the exam schedule [here](#). Students from Secondary 1 to 5 only need to come to school when they have an exam or a review session. Students in the alternative paths program have classes until Tuesday June 16th, 2026. Do not forget that some students in the Semi-Skilled program will need to write some exams. For the French writing exam secondary 1 to 4 only, some students will be exempted. These specific families will receive an email from their specific teachers. All other students must be present for all of their exams. It is important to note that there was a small change in the secondary 1 blocked exam schedule. Please check the exam schedule properly on the website.

Absences During the Blocked Exam Schedule: Attendance during the blocked exam schedule is compulsory. Absences will only be considered valid if supported by a medical certificate or a court order. Students without a valid reason, justified by official documentation, will not be granted additional time to complete their exams. For Ministry exams, please note that the school cannot arrange an alternate sitting. If a student is absent, they will be required to take the exam during the official August 2026 session, regardless of the reason for the absence.

Bus Transportation: The bus drivers will have a copy of the exam schedule and will only allow the students that have an exam or a review session scheduled.

Summer School: All the information about summer school is always available on the [school board's website](#). It will be updated during the month of June. It is important to remember that for Secondary 1 and Secondary 2, it is a summer enrichment program only. The summer enrichment program is not intended to help students pass a course they have already failed. It is an opportunity for students to consolidate their learning so they can begin the next academic year with a stronger foundation for success. There are no exams or other summative evaluations. No marks on their final report card will be changed. The school will inform families of their child's placement for the 2026–2027 school year, as well as the possibility of summer school for students in Secondary 3, 4, and 5, starting on Thursday June 25th, 2026.

Cafeteria Services: The last day of operation will be Thursday June 18th, 2026. They will serve what is left in their inventory. Options will include salad, pizza, wraps, bagels, and paninis. We encourage students to bring their own lunch if these options are not to their liking. Aramark will return as our official cafeteria food supplier in September 2026.

Reminder for the Dress Code: As warmer days approach, we would like to remind all families and students that a dress code is outlined in our school's Code of Conduct.

Over the years, including this one, we have taken a flexible approach in its application. However, we are now seeing that some students are increasingly testing the limits of this flexibility, which can lead to inappropriate situations. We kindly ask that all students respect the dress code for the remaining days of the school year. Very short shorts including the ones resembling undergarments will not be permitted during exam days. The same will apply to the next school year. Our Code of Conduct specifies that shorts, dresses, and skirts must be longer than mid-thigh. Tops that are low-cut in the front or back, or that expose the midriff, are also not permitted. Undergarments must be covered by clothing and must not be visible. Sheer clothing may only be worn over opaque garments that comply with the above-mentioned dress code. Nightwear and pajamas are not allowed at school unless it is part of an approved activity day. Students who do not comply with these guidelines may be asked to change into appropriate attire. In summary, we are simply asking students to dress in a manner appropriate for a school setting.

Reminder on School Ground Rule, Sign-In and Sign-Out: During the exam period, the restriction to school grounds remains in effect for students in Secondary 1 and 2. After their exams, they may remain only in designated areas: the cafeteria, library, computer lab, games room, outdoor school property, or optional review sessions. Secondary 1 and 2 students are not permitted to leave school grounds under any circumstances, even with parental permission. Students in Secondary 3, 4, and 5, including those in the alternative pathway, may leave school grounds at lunchtime as usual. However, they must return to the school for the afternoon portion and remain in designated areas. If any student (Secondary 1 to 5) wishes to leave for the remainder of the day, they must report in person to the office to sign out and confirm that they will not be returning. Families are required to notify the school through Mozaïk or by calling the school to authorize the departure. Please note that no student (Secondary 1 to 5) may sign out during the day and later return to take the afternoon bus.

Cell Phone Rule: Please note that the rule regarding cell phones applies as stated in the code of conduct and remains in effect until the last day of exams. The full regulation is available at all times on the school's website. It is important that students comply with this rule at all times, from Wednesday, June 10, 2026, to Tuesday, June 23, 2026.

Locker Clean-Up and Library Books: On Tuesday June 9th, 2026 Students will be asked to empty their locker and bring most of their belonging at home. Students in Secondary 1 to 4 may keep their locks and bring them back for the 2026–2027 school year. Secondary 5 students can give their locks back to the student supervisors. If any students still have library books in their possession, please ensure they return them to the office as soon as possible.
